## **SPIRIT WANDERER**

My Title, spirit wanderer, makes reference to the psychocosmos—the visionary WORLD within which divagate PSYCHOPTIC SNUFF-USERS... of ancient and modern times. This painting focuses-on three different PSYCHOPTIC SNUFFS. At the upper left, there hangs a photograph of South América, taken from low-Earth-orbit. To its right, there hangs my LANDSCAPE, of San Pedro de Atacama, Chile—where, in archaïc times, the ritual use of Anadenanthera-SNUFF was a prominent practice. Below this LANDSCAPE hang three botanical paintings [from left to right]: Nicotiana tabacum; a panicle of FLOWERS of Virola theiodora; and a BRANCH, SEED-POD and SEEDS of Anandenanthera colubrina. The WALLPAPER is adorned with Anadenanthera-FLOWERS. Upon the TABLE, stand arrayed [from left to right]: *a brace* of SEED-PODS, of *Anadenanthera colubrina*, beneath which lie several loose SEEDS. Above these, is a SNUFF-TRAY, previously in the collection of EL MUSEO ARQUEOLÓGICO R.P. LEPAIGE, of San Pedro de Atacama. The present whereabouts of this exquisite TRAY are unknown—most probably, it had been stolen! The **snuff-tube**, to its right, thankfully, remains in their collection. *Three* FLOWERS of *Nicotiana rustica* rest atop the SNUFF-TRAY. At the upper-edge of the TABLE, there lies a small container holding *Virola-SNUFF.* To its right, we find a *single* LEAF of TOBACCO, enwrapped by a green ligature. Below the Atacaman **snuff-tube** are arrayed *three* pieces of *Virola-*BARK. To their right, sits my botanical painting, of *Nicotiana rustica*. Atop the painting rests a SHELL—such shells were used as **SNUFF-CONTAINERS**, in ancient San Pedro de Atacama. This particular one I collected, from the home of a Wichi-shaman, in NorthWest Argentina. Atop my *Nicotiana*-painting is another: of *Virola*-LEAVES. Atop that, from Amazônia, we see a typical **SNUFF-TUBE**, for *self-*administration. At the right-hand-corner of the painting... discretely, there lie two COCA-LEAVES.
